Stores Galore

Book: *Before Online Shopping*

Series: What Did We Do?

Level: Beacon

Objective

To help students practice using dictionaries, context clues, and glossaries to determine the meanings of unfamiliar words.

Supplies

- *Before Online Shopping* book
- Stores Galore worksheet (attached)
- A dictionary, such as Merriam-Webster online: <https://www.merriam-webster.com/>

Before the Activity

Read *Before Online Shopping*, or assign it to students to read on their own.

Activity

Before online shopping existed, people were more likely to go to stores in person. Often, they visited several different kinds of stores to get what they needed. Pass out the Stores Galore worksheet to students, explaining that the worksheet lists the names of several different kinds of stores. Students should match each store's name to the appropriate definition. Some of the definitions can be found in the *Before Online Shopping* book. For others, students will need to look up the word in a dictionary.

Evaluation

Collect the worksheets and use the attached answer key to give students 1 point for each correct answer, for up to 12 points.

Standards

This lesson may be used to address the Common Core State Standards' language standards, grade 3 (L 3.4).

florist	a store that cuts and sells meat
department store	a store that sells men's clothing
confectionery	a store that sells and arranges flowers and plants
barbershop	a store that adjusts clothes for a better fit
consignment shop	a store that sells chocolates and other candy
